'If March comes in like a lion it will go out as a lamb' (Thomas Fuller 1732)

This year that has been far from true. March did come like a lion we saw red alerts all around the country for extreme weather conditions. However, it certainly didn't go out like a lamb. In fact, it seems to have been a long winter this year. Even in April they were forecasting snow! Now the summer is coming and we all feel so much better.

Many people over the winter months do suffer from a recognised condition called SAD - Seasonal Affective Disorder. People feel depressed, lethargic, anxious and irritable. Our spirits become brighter when we enjoy the sunshine and warmth. We have 'a feel good factor'.

We all go through dark and difficult times in our lives; as human beings we all know fear and failure, suffering and pain. Some of the great characters in the Bible also had times of depression. *King David confessed: 'I am worn out calling for help; my throat is parched. My eyes fail, looking for my God.' (Psalm 29:3) Elijah declared: 'I have had enough, Lord. Take my life; I am no better than my ancestors.' (1 Kings 19:4)*

Jeremiah uttered: 'Cursed be the day I was born' (Jeremiah 20:14) Yet even in the dark times they knew God was with them. One psalm that has been very special for people going through these hard and painful times is Psalm 23. I am sure many of us will recognise it as the hymn 'The Lord's my shepherd'. Here the psalmist talks about going through 'the valley of the shadow of death'. This can be taken in a literal sense, referring to when we actually die, but also metaphorically: those times in our lives when we feel despondent, there seems little hope, and all is gloomy. In fact some translations read: 'Even though I walk through the darkest valley I fear no evil, for you are with me.'

The psalmist takes great comfort from the fact that God is always there and never abandons him. As a Shepherd cares and looks after his sheep, so God will always be there for us. In Israel in the time of Jesus, the relationship between a shepherd and his sheep was incredibly close. A shepherd would guard his sheep against outside dangers, even risking his own life. Jesus tells the story of a shepherd leaving his 99 sheep and searching for one lost sheep, no matter how long it took to find it. Jesus tells us that is how special we are to God.

God doesn't leave us to go through those dark times, those valleys, waving us off and saying he will meet us on the other side. Instead he goes through the valley with us.

So if life is hard for you at the moment, remember you are never alone. God will never leave you or abandon you.



One night I dreamed I was walking along the beach with the Lord. Many scenes from my life flashed across the sky.

In each scene I noticed footprints in the sand. Sometimes there were two sets of footprints, other times there was one only. This bothered me because I noticed that during the low periods of my life, when I was suffering from anguish, sorrow or defeat, I could see only one set of footprints, so I said to the Lord,

"You promised me Lord, that if I followed you, you would walk with me always. But I have noticed that during the most trying periods of my life there has only been one set of footprints in the sand. Why, when I needed you most, have you not been there for me?"

Welcare In Bromley

Sara - Case study

Sara is a 31 year old single parent with a physical disability. She has a 6 year old son Michael who has autism. Sara was having problems with managing Michael's behaviour at home and was also experiencing difficulties with her finances and housing. Sara had limited social networks and only had her mother who provided her some support at times.

Sara became aware of Welcare, through a member of her church who provided her with a Welcare leaflet and prompted Sara to contact Welcare directly to enquire about services available. Sara referred herself to Welcare to get some support with managing Michael's(10 years old) challenging behaviour and some information on budgeting and managing her finances.

On the Family Support Worker's (FSW) initial visit to Sara the family star tool was used to assess the areas in which she needed the most help. Sara identified that she needed most support with home and money, physical health and behaviour and boundaries. This provided the basis for a family plan of support and clear objectives to be reviewed at the end of the family support intervention.

The FSW provided Sara with an intensive 6 weekly sessions of parenting support, where Sara was offered parenting skills training with particular focus on implementing positive disciplinary strategies with her son and providing clear and consistent boundaries.

By the fourth session Sara had demonstrated some of the improvements made in her parenting style and had reported that she felt more confident in her parenting skills overall. The last two

sessions were primarily focused on home and money. Sara was able to access additional benefits. By the end of the parenting programme Sara reported that she felt more confident and could see that there was a positive change in Michael's behaviour. Sara was also referred to a parenting support group for parents with children with autism. Sara felt that this also helped her to manage Michael's behaviour more effectively.

Sara also identified that she was experiencing financial difficulties. The FSW used an income and expenditure tool to see if there were any ways in which she could save money. An online benefit eligibility form was completed and it became apparent that Sara might be entitled to claim an additional benefit due to her physical disability. One of our family support volunteers assisted her in filling out the form and she was awarded the benefit which reduced the financial strain that she had been experiencing.

Sara's confidence has now improved and she now takes part in a forum for parents of autistic children and her social networks have been enhanced.

Sara recently attended the Christmas toy distribution. She was overwhelmed by the kindness and generosity that was shown by all the donated toys she received.

She said that thanks to Welcare, Michael was able to have a wonderful Christmas and for the first time she was actually excited about experiencing Christmas with her family.

Growth Marches On!

Daylight lengthens as we head towards the summer solstice, yet many plants have already flowered, set seed and growing on to build reserves for next year. But for continued growth and further flowers to extend the season, we sometimes have to assist with some judicial pruning and dead heading. Even the 'Chelsea Chop', introduced a decade ago of cutting back growth can, not only delay flowering, but if done carefully part of the group can flower normally and the other part flower later. Whilst the simple operation with thumb and forefinger is pinching out the flower bud, spent or not, or the new growth, it can provide a bushier habit and many more flowers. However, to increase fruit production is a different story, instead the process is to encourage flowers to set fruit, which encompasses the seed.

All plants will need feeding at some point, whether by distributing chicken pellets or Growmore at the base of the plant or using liquid feed. Tomatoes however,



will require a high potash feed to encourage flower growth and eventual fruit. Whether fruit or flowers are grown in containers the food in the compost will only last for a maximum 6 weeks before a supplement feed needs to be introduced. There are a number of different products available at garden centres and on line. Two products, seaweed based, a general fertiliser and Tomorite, supplied by a number of different companies, a high potash feed are two examples. All products

will show a ratio, for example, a general feed, the ratio will show 1:1:1, while a high potash will show a similar ratio 10:15:20. The ratio is based on the three main elements, N is for Nitrogen, for new growth, P is for Phosphorus, for root growth and K is for Potash, for fruit and flowers (NPK)

Feeding is an operation that needs to be carried out at least once a week for containers, however, as the roots fill the container, nutrients are used up within 6 weeks, the frequency needs to be increased, perhaps 3 -4 times a week. With regards to the pruning, most tomatoes grown on a single cordon, will need to have their side shoots removed, using your important digits or a pair of scissors or secateurs. The plants can then concentrate their efforts on producing the flowers and the eventual fruit. Commercially, tomatoes are grown this way under glass, however, they are grown across wires throughout the season producing flowers and fruit. Whilst at home, they are secured to bamboos, string or frames. Other tomatoes can be grown in hanging baskets and containers, without the need for pinching out the growth or grown as bush varieties.



With many seasonal plants, tomatoes are now in abundance in many garden centres, particularly tender perennials, such as Marguerites, Osteospermum, Nemesia, and Fuchsias. There is plenty of opportunity to take advantage of young non flowering growth by taking plenty of soft nodal cuttings, a cheap way to increase your stock to fill gaps in the garden later. Using potting compost mixed with perlite or sharp grit, fill a small pot, and insert

several cuttings around the rim of the pot and water in. Keep moist and place a polythene bag such as a sandwich bag over the pot and cuttings, using an elastic band to keep the bag in situ and place on a non-sunny windowsill. After a couple of weeks, roots will start to appear out the bottom of the pot. Separate them and pot them on singly, grow on ready to introduce in the border or container.

It is an enjoyable time of year, early enough to try and experiment, take cuttings, pruning, cutting back, working with plants can be very rewarding.

The Biggin Horticultural Society has some extremely interesting talks again this year. Become a member at £5 per household, receive your handbook and you will have all the dates and other information close at hand.



St. Mark's is known as the "Moving Church" as in the 1950's it was constructed from materials brought from the redundant church of All Saints North Peckham. This remarkable feat of dismantling and building carried out by local Biggin Hill people was accomplished through the initiative and vision of the then vicar, The Revd. Vivian Symons. He mobilised the local parishioners to create a truly worthy parish church in place of their ageing corrugated iron building. This fascinating story is recounted in an illustrated colour guide available from the Church.

We want to share the good news of God's love in Jesus Christ with all those in our parish and neighbourhood. Hopefully this is portrayed by the way we live our lives, and speak to others.

We respect that we are all children of God, and we want to discover Christ in each other, encouraging personal growth in our individual relationship with each other and with Jesus.

Worship is an integral part of our love for God, and we want our services to reflect dignity and sensitivity as well as joy and thanksgiving.

St. Mark's Church, Biggin Hill - People's Prayer
